The Grizzly Gamut Yearbook staff would like to tell you about a few procedures pertaining to senior portraits and yearbooks.

For senior portraits, it is our pleasure to introduce **Leasure Designer Portraits** as our **official portrait studio**. We contracted the Leasure studio because of their commitment to provide our seniors with affordable portraits, with excellent service and with premium quality.

For the success of our yearbook it is imperative that **senior pictures are taken during the 2015 summer vacation and that students adhere to the BHS dress code for the yearbook pose during their session**. Any photos not taken at Leasure Designer Portraits before August 30, 2016, may not be included in the yearbook. We respectfully request that students dress a cut above for their senior portraits, while maintaining the BHS dress code: garments that are “see-through,” cut low, spaghetti straps, or expose one’s midriff or under-garments are not acceptable. In addition, hats are not allowed. It is our belief that school pride, morale and image are influenced by the general appearance of our students. If you are out of dress code, your photo will not be included in the yearbook. Lastly, only the “yearbook pose” can be used in the publication. Over the shoulder, sideways, or other poses cannot be chosen to appear in the yearbook.

It is also important to note that **we are unable to utilize senior portraits taken by other studios**. Basha High School administration and the Grizzly Gamut Yearbook Staff reserve the right to deny placement of senior photos in the yearbook if these guidelines are not met. Sitting for your yearbook portrait is **FREE**, so call now to schedule an appointment!
